Recently retired WMC board chairman receives THA award

FRANKLIN, TENN. – Isaac “Ike” Brown recently was awarded the 2010 Meritorious Service Award for governance from the Tennessee Hospital Association. The award recognizes leadership and service by individuals in support of THA member hospitals, health systems and home health agencies.

“No one is more worthy of the Meritorious Service Award than Ike Brown,” says Dennis Miller, chief executive officer of Williamson Medical Center. “His demonstrated leadership and service to Williamson Medical Center and Williamson County are immeasurable.”

Brown served on Williamson Medical Center’s Board of Trustees for 24 years, the last six as chairman, before retiring earlier this year. During his tenure, Williamson Medical Center transformed from a community hospital to its establishment as an independent, fully-accredited regional medical center. He led WMC through a \$100 million building expansion, various partnerships and a multitude of new and improved service lines.

Prior to taking the helm as board chairman in 2004, Brown served on the board’s Finance Committee. He retired in 1999 as treasurer and chief financial officer of the General Board of Discipleship, an agency of the United Methodist Church.
